

NATIONAL AND FIVE-STATE SURVEY OF THE 2020 LATINO ELECTORATE





Methodology


- N=1,854 eligible Latino voters
 - Registered N=1,506
 - Eligible not registered N=348
- State samples at least N=300 each in AZ, CA, FL, NV, TX
- Field Dates: June 1-14, 2019
- English or Spanish, according to respondent preference
- Blended sample, online and live telephone interviews
- Margin of error of + / 2.3 percentage points

Which of the following traits do you think are important in a presidential candidate?



Percent responding trait is <u>"very important"</u> in a presidential candidate


Values diversity and brings people together	76%
Fights for my priorities, willing to work with both parties, compromise to get things done	74%
Has realistic, achievable policy ideas and goals	73%
Has specific plans addressing the issues Latino voters say are important to them	61%
Has bold and ambitious policy ideas, even if they are hard to achieve quickly	56%
Has prior experience in elected office	54%
Fights for my priorities and will not compromise, even if it means nothing gets done	51%
Has business or private sector work experience	41%
Speaks Spanish	33%

[Top three "very important" illustrated for each state]




Most Important Candidate Quality

As you may know, next year, in 2020, there will be a presidential election. In your opinion, what issues would an ideal presidential candidate focus on most? In order of importance, what are your top three?



Factors Driving Priority Issues

What is it about [issue ranked first among issue priorities] that concerns you?

These reasons are the same in every state.

- Among those who ranked jobs and economy first priority
 - Not enough jobs, job insecurity/stability
 - Post-recession, people worry about keeping their jobs
- Among those who ranked health care first priority
 - Too expensive, unaffordable
- Among those who ranked immigration first
 - Stop separating families, abuses/children in cages

I am frustrated with how President Trump and his allies treat immigrants and Latinos, worry it will get worse if Trump is re-elected.


I am concerned that Social Security will not be around when I retire, or that my current benefits could be cut.

It seems like politicians in Washington DC ignore people like me, they take Latino voters for granted.


I am concerned that I may not be able to afford to own a home, or afford to keep the one I have now.

Immigration Policy Priority


Which immigration issue do you want a new President to address first?

Stopping the Trump Administration's practice of separating undocumented children from their parents at the border.


Comprehensive immigration reform that provides an earned path to citizenship for nearly 11 million undocumented people living and working in the United States.

Building a 1,900-mile wall between the entire border between the United States and Mexico.




Immigration Policy Priority





Have you ever voted for a Republican candidate in past elections?




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
Softness in party support












So looking at the entire pool of Latino registered voters








Imagine if the GOP really leaned in on positive, respectful Latino outreach...


Or if Dems seriously invest in outreach and engagement with Latinos the way DCCC did (Lujan/Sena) in 2018


Participation in the 2020 Democratic Primaries and Caucuses

Key Findings

- Ideal candidate values diversity and will unify the country, has realistic policy goals, and plans to get them done.
- Ideal candidate will address issues that resonate at personal level for this electorate: employment, wages, health care costs, immigration, and basic respect for the community.
- Republicans leaving votes on the table
 - More than half prior GOP voters have hard time supporting the party today.
- Democrat leads Trump by 3-to-1 margin
 - Only 50% of self-identified Republicans certain they will vote for Trump.
 - > But, only 57% of self-identified Dems certain to vote in primaries.
