Univision News, in collaboration with the civil rights organization Unidos US, conducted a survey interviewing 2,200 Latino adults in the United States between March 16 -27, 2021. Of those, 1400 were collected as a national sample, while another 800 were oversampled in emerging communities. Overall, 300 counties were identified as emerging communities with the highest rates of Latino growth or the largest numerical Latino population increases between 2000 and 2019, as reported by the Census and American Community Survey, and excluding rapid growing counties in traditionally Latino areas.

The margin-of-error for the entire study is +/-2.1%, and the MOE for the oversample is +/- 3.5%. Residents were interviewed in English or Spanish, choice made available upon first contact. In total, 35% of interviews were completed on live telephone calls, and 65% were completed online but 50% of those in the oversample were completed on live telephone calls. The survey was overseen by Dr. Sergio Garcia-Rios, director of polling for Univision, and administered by BSP Research.
